## **THIS IS USA HOCKEY**

USA Hockey, Inc., is the National Governing Body for the sport of ice hockey in the United States. Its mission is to promote the growth of hockey in America and provide the best possible experience for all participants by encouraging, developing, advancing and administering the sport.

USA Hockey's primary emphasis is on the support and development of grassroots hockey programs. In January 2009, the organization launched the American Development Model, which - for the first time ever - provides associations nationwide with a blueprint for optimal athlete development.

While youth hockey is a main focus, USA Hockey also has vibrant junior and adult hockey programs that provide opportunities for players of all ability levels. The organization also supports a growing disabled hockey program and maintains an inline hockey program to provide structure and support for its growth across the nation.

Beyond serving those who play the game at the amateur level, USA Hockey has certification programs for coaches and officials to ensure education standards are met that coincide with the level of play. Furthermore, a large focus is put on parent education with equipment needs, rules of the game and parental roles in youth sports among common topics.

Members of the organization are entitled to many benefits, including a subscription to USA Hockey Magazine, the most widely circulated hockey publication in the world; excess accident, general liability and catastrophic insurance coverage; access to USAHockey.com; and opportunities to participate in USA Hockey National Championships, as well as player development camps.

USA Hockey is the official representative to the United States Olympic Committee and the International Ice Hockey Federation. In this role, USA Hockey is responsible for organizing and training men's and women's team for international tournaments, including the IIHF World Championships and the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. Closer to home, USA Hockey works closely with the National Hockey League and the National Collegiate Athletic Association on matters of mutual interest.

USA Hockey is divided into 12 geographical districts throughout the United States. Each district has a registrar to register teams; a referee-in-chief to register officials and organize clinics; a coach-in-chief to administer education program for coaches; a risk manager to oversee liability and safety programs; and a skill development program administrator to facilitate learn-to-play programs for youth players and their parents.

# **2010 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM STAFF**



## Head Coach Dean Blais

Dean Blais will return behind the bench of the U.S. National Junior Team for the fourth time, having served as head coach for Team USA at the 1994 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship and as an assistant coach in 1988 and 1989.

Blais' long history with USA Hockey also includes having played for the 1973 U.S. Men's National Team and having served as an assistant coach for both the 1992 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and the 2000 U.S. Men's National Team.

Blais played four years of hockey (1969-73) at the University of Minnesota before joining the U.S. Men's National Team in 1973. After skating three years with the Chicago Blackhawks' minor-league affiliate in Dallas, he began his coaching career in 1976-77 as an assistant at the University of Minnesota. He then served as the head coach at Minot (N.D.) High School from 1977-80, before a nine-year stint as an assistant coach at the University of North Dakota.

Blais left North Dakota to be the head coach at Roseau (Minn.) High School in 1989-90, and guided his team to the Minnesota State High School title. He coached Roseau to a conference and regional championship in 1991 before being named as an assistant coach for the 1992 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team that took fourth place at the Olympic Winter Games in Albertville, France. Following the Olympics, Blais signed on as athletic director and hockey coach at International Falls (Minn.) High School.

He returned to the University of North Dakota as head coach in 1994. During his 10-year tenure, he led the Fighting Sioux to seven NCAA tournament appearances, NCAA Division I National Championships in 1997 and 2000, and an overall record of 262-115-33. He left North Dakota to serve as the associate head coach of the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets in 2004.

Most recently, Blais served as head coach and general manager of the United States Hockey League's Fargo Force, and was named the 2009 USHL Coach of the Year after leading the Force to the USHL's Clark Cup finals in their first year of play. He will take on a new venture in 2009-10 as the head men's ice hockey coach at the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

Blais resides in International Falls, Minn., and is the father of three grown children: Sarah, Ben and Mary Beth.



## Assistant Coach John Hynes

John Hynes will return behind the bench of the U.S. National Junior Team for the fourth time, having served as the head coach for Team USA in 2008 and as an assistant coach in 2004 and 2006.

Hynes is entering his seventh season as a head coach with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program and is the longest tenured coach in program history. He has also served as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team at the International Ice Hockey Federation's World Men's Under-18 Championship in 2004, 2006 and 2008, and was an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team in 2002.

As a player, Hynes was a three-year (1994-97) letter winner at Boston University and helped the team capture the 1995 NCAA Division I National Championship. He began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1997 as a graduate assistant before joining the NTDP in 1998.

Hynes resides in Dexter, Mich., with his wife, Sarah, and their daughters, Sophia and Julia.

## Assistant Coach Mark Osiecki

Mark Osiecki is joining his first U.S. National Junior Team coaching staff after having coached two U.S. Men's National Under-18 Teams and a U.S. Junior Select Team.

Osiecki served as head coach of the 1999 U.S. National Under-18 Team that took part in the International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Under-18 Championship in Slovakia, and was an assistant for the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team the following year in the Czech Republic. He also led the U.S. Junior Select Team to a gold medal at the 1998 Freedom Challenge in Lake Placid, N.Y.

The former University of Wisconsin defenseman earned three letters (1987-90) and served as an assistant captain of the 1990 NCAA Division I National Championship team. He enjoyed a two-year (1991-93) NHL playing career with the Calgary Flames, Ottawa Senators, Winnipeg Jets and Minnesota North Stars, and competed for the United States at the 1992 IIHF Men's World Championship in Prague, Czech Republic.

Osiecki is entering his fifth season as an assistant coach at Wisconsin, having spent seven seasons (1997-2004) as the general manager and head coach of the United States Hockey League's Green Bay Gamblers.

He and his wife, Robin, reside in Madison, Wis., with their daughter, Emily, and their son, Jake.



## Assistant Coach Joe Exter

Joe Exter is joining his first U.S. National Junior Team after having spent two years as the USA Hockey National Team Development Program's first-ever full-time goaltending coach.

His responsibilities with USA Hockey's NTDP include planning, designing and executing the regular on-ice practices for goaltenders, as well as scouting and evaluating the nation's top goaltending prospects. Exter has also been tabbed as the coordinator of the revolutionary Warren Strelow National Goaltending Mentor Program, which is designed to recruit, develop and produce elite goaltenders in the United States.
